Spay/Neuter Clinic Opens in Bensonhurst







Finally, there is good news for Brooklyn's homeless cats! Cat caretakers, cat rescuers, and TNR service providers were left with limited options when a new policy eliminated mobile spay and neuter clinics throughout Brooklyn. TNR providers who could not transport cats to the new facility in Queens were not able to plan spay and neuter projects as freely as they could before. But that is about to change.

Thanks to the generosity of people in our community and the Ferals in Peril Board of Directors, Denise and Peter Szalaiko of Ferals in Peril are about to open a free spay and neuter clinic in Bensonhurst. Beginning in July, the clinic will provide free spay and neuter services for feral cats and cats whose owners are unable to afford to have their pets spayed and neutered.

On Tuesday, July 19th, Ferals in Peril will hold a special orientation and instructional session for anyone in the community who is interested in using the clinic. This is not a TNR certification workshop, but the session will include a "TNR 101" informational segment to familiarize attendees with basics of TNR (trap-neuter-return) and details of clinic procedures.

For people who attended two previous "Helping Homeless Cats" talks, this session will offer new information. Attending this talk will enable all to meet and network with people in Bensonhurst and surrounding communities who want to help give homeless cats and kittens the chance to live better lives.
